Employees whose work activities may contact asbestos containing material (ACM) or presumed asbestos containing material (PACM) but do not disturb the ACM or PACM during their work activities.	Asbestos Awareness Training <i>29 CFR 1910.1001</i>	Prior to or at the time of initial assignment and at least annually thereafter.

Contractors performing renovation, repair and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities, and schools built before 1978 must be certified and must follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination.	Renovation Repair Painting Rule <i>40 CFR Part 745</i> <i>NOTE: Military personnel are not required to take this training but must receive approval from the Asbestos/Lead Manager prior to performing any repair or painting operations.</i>	Receive 8 hours of training before performing renovation, repair or painting on facilities sited in the description. 8 hours of refresher training thereafter every 5 years.
Individuals assigned to accomplish environmental compliance requirements on behalf of his/her responsible commander, director, or supervisor.	Environmental Officer Course <i>AR 200-1</i>	Receive training within a year of assignment. Submit appointment orders to Environmental Division
Contractors, builders, developer, site superintendents, grading and utility contractors, and monitoring consultants.
