MEMORANDUM FOR All Personnel, U.S. Army Garrison

SUBJECT: Garrison Commander's Policy Memorandum No. 37 – Garrison Safety Program

1. References.

- a. PL 91-596, Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970.
- b. 29 CFR Part 1960, Basic Program Elements for Federal Employee Occupational Safety and Health Programs and Related Matters.
- c. AR 385-10, The Army Safety Program, dtd 4 Oct 11.

2. Purpose: To establish a policy that supports and implements references 1a - c.

3. Applicability: This policy applies to all personnel assigned to the Fort Gordon Garrison.

4. Background: Fort Gordon Garrison is not automatically safe. We have to create safety daily through practice at all levels. Compliance with occupational safety and health policies is required. These standards establish the minimum acceptable level of "what right looks like".

5. Responsibilities – All Personnel.

- a. Each member of the Fort Gordon Garrison will comply with mandated safety and occupational health policies and action plans. All personnel will take quick and effective action when standards are violated and take adequate corrective measures to prevent reoccurrence. This includes reporting of all accidents, near-misses and unsafe/unhealthy working conditions to the proper level of management.

- b. Mission pressures influence people's trade-offs, making what was previously thought of as irregular or unsafe, as now normal or acceptable. Everyone will ensure shortcuts are not tolerated, regardless of influence.

c. Our present day budget cannot support the total fix of every hazard, even though any loss will adversely impact the war fighting mission. Leaders must walk the terrain. Get out, see and mitigate the hazards to which your personnel and mission are exposed and improve what you can in the interim, until a final fix can be made.
