SUBJECT: Installation Food Service Memorandum Policy No. 56 - Dress Code Requirements for Fort Gordon Installation Dining Facilities

1. References:

- a. AR 670-1, 3 March 2005, Wear and Appearance of Army Uniforms and Insignia.
- b. AR 30-22, 24 July 2012, The Army Food Program.

2. All patrons will be in compliance with the Commanding General's Policy Letter #19, regarding appropriate dress in Military facilities. In addition to Policy #19, adherence to the following additional rules apply within all Garrison dining facilities:

- a. Personnel entering or utilizing the dining facilities will be dressed in good taste and maintain a respectable standard of appearance.
- b. Shoes and shirts will be worn at all times. No shower shoes will be worn at any time.
- c. Shirts intended to be worn as undergarments that are apart of the military uniform will not be worn as outer garments. Tank tops, blouses without bras, sleeveless shirts exposing the armpits, or see-through shirts will not be worn.
- d. No bathing suits of any type will be worn at any time.
- e. No clothing with iron-ons, slogans, or patches, which are sexually suggestive, contains profanity, or are in bad taste will be allowed.
- f. No mixed uniforms or any part of a uniform will be worn with civilian attire, including motor pool "coveralls," PT uniforms, brown ACU tee-shirts, or plain white tee-shirts.
- g. No denim jeans with holes, cut-off shorts that have strings hanging, or shorts that are too suggestive will be worn at any time.

h. No headgear, civilian or military, will be worn by any personnel, except authorized food service personnel, food inspectors, and military police under arms. No hair curlers, scarves, bandannas, or anything of this nature will be worn at any time.

3. Individuals who do not comply with these guidelines will make the appropriate correction or will be asked to leave the dining facility. Officers and noncommissioned officers will enforce the dress code, as required.

4. These guidelines are designated to uphold the values of the United States Army and the good reputation of the installation.
